2	AN ACT TO ENCOURAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH IN RURAL NORTH
3	CAROLINA BY EXPANDING THE SMALL TOWNS ECONOMIC
4	PROSPERITY PROGRAM AND INCENTIVES TO REUSE AND RENOVATE
5	VACANT BUILDINGS AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE RURAL
6	ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CENTER, INC., FOR THE SMALL TOWNS
7	ECONOMIC PROSPERITY PROGRAM AND THE BUILDING REUSE
8	PROGRAM.
9	Whereas, shifts in the economy away from traditional manufacturing have
10	left many plants and downtown businesses vacant across the State; and
11	Whereas, when located in rural areas, these vacant buildings usually remain
12	vacant; and
13	Whereas, in 2004, the General Assembly established the Building Reuse and
14	Restoration Program within the Rural Economic Center, Inc., as a part of the Rural
15	Economic Infrastructure Fund; and
16	Whereas, the Building Reuse and Restoration Program has been successful in
17	spurring economic activity and job creation by assisting in the productive reuse of
18	vacant buildings in small towns; and
19	Whereas, since 2004, the Building Reuse and Restoration Program has
20	funded 43 projects resulting in private sector businesses creating jobs for 2,279 people;
21	and
22	Whereas, in 2005, the General Assembly decided to include the Building
23	Reuse and Restoration Program in the recurring budget; and
24	Whereas, in 2006, the Rural Economic Development Center, Inc., initiated
25	the Small Towns Economic Prosperity Program and selected 33 small towns to design
26	and carry out economic expansion strategies; and
27	Whereas, many more small towns have shown a readiness to help their
28	economy transition from economic decline toward recovery; Now, therefore,
