new evaluation or remove a planned evaluation.
(b) <u>Request. – A request to the Program Evaluation Division for an evaluation</u>
a program or an activity of a State agency must be submitted by a member of t
General Assembly. The Director of the Division must review each request
accordance with the following criteria and make a recommendation to the Jo
Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee on whether to amend t
Division's work plan to include the requested evaluation:
(1) <u>The work required to conduct the requested evaluation.</u>
(2) <u>The effect that conducting the requested evaluation will have on t</u>
Division's ability to complete its work plan.
(3) The significance of the requested evaluation compared to t
evaluations to be conducted under the work plan.
(4) <u>Any overlap between the requested evaluation and other evaluation</u> previously conducted by the Division or another agency.

A report of an evaluation of a program or an activity of a State agency by t
Program Evaluation Division of the General Assembly must include the following:
(1) The findings of the Division concerning the program or activity.
(2) Specific recommendations for making the program or activity mo
efficient or effective.
(3) Any legislation needed to implement the Division's findings a
recommendations concerning the program or activity.
(4) An estimate of the costs or savings expected from implementing t
Division's findings and recommendations concerning the program
activity.

(a) Membership. – The Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversig
Committee is established. The Committee consists of 16 members as follows:

4	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law. Notwithstanding
5	G.S. 120-36.15, as enacted by Section 3 of this act, the terms of the initial members of
6	the Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee begin on appointment
7	and end on January 15, 2009.
