8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	SECTION 1. G.S. 88A-2 reads as rewritten:
10	"§ 88A-2. Purpose.
11	The purpose of this Chapter is to ensure minimum standards of competency, to
12	protect the public from misrepresentation of status by persons who hold themselves out
13	to be "certified electrologists",'licensed electrologists' or 'licensed laser clinicians' and to
14	provide the public with safe care by the mandatory licensing of
15	electrologists.electrologists and laser clinicians."
16	SECTION 2. G.S. 88A-3 is amended by adding the following new
17	subdivisions to read:
18	"§ 88A-3. Definitions.

44		be renewed annually. On or before the date the current license expires, a

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1	person who desires to continue to practice electrology or as a laser clinician shall apply
2	for license renewal to the Board on forms approved by the Board, provide evidence of
3	the successful completion of a continuing educational program approved by the Board,
4	meet the criteria for renewal established by the Board, and pay the required fee. The
5	Board may provide for the late renewal of licensure upon payment of a late fee as set by
6	the Board, but late renewal may not be granted more than 90 days after expiration of the
7	license.
8	(b) Any person who has failed to renew his or her license for more than 90 days
9	after expiration may have it reinstated by applying to the Board for reinstatement on a
10	form approved by the Board, furnishing a statement of the reason for failure to apply for

14	"(d) Laser clinicians are required to complete 10 hours of continuing education
16	annually to maintain their licenses."
17	SECTION 8. Chapter 88A of the General Statutes is amended by adding the
18	following new section to read:
19	" <u>§ 88A-17.1. Requirements for licensure as a laser clinician instructor.</u>
20	(a) Any person who desires licensure as a laser clinician instructor pursuant to
21	this Chapter shall meet the following requirements:
22	(1) Submit an application on a form approved by the Board.
23	(2) Be a licensed electrologist.
24	(3) Have practiced laser and light-based treatments actively for at least
25	five years immediately before applying for licensure.
26	(4) Have at least 100 hours of training in laser and light-based treatments.
27	(b) When the Board determines that an applicant has met all qualifications for
28	licensure as a laser clinician instructor and has submitted the required fee, the Board
29	shall issue an instructor's license to the applicant."
30	SECTION 9. G.S. 88A-18 reads as rewritten:
31	"§ 88A-18. Renewal of instructor's certificate.<u>license.</u>
32	An <u>electrology or laser clinician</u> instructor's certificate <u>license</u> shall be renewed
33	annually. On or before the date the current certificate license expires, the applicant must
34	submit an application for renewal of certification licensure on a form approved by the
35	Board, meet criteria for renewal established by the Board, and pay the required fee. Any
36	person whose instructor's certificate license has expired for a period of five three years
37 38	or more shall be required to take and pass the instructor's examination before the certificate-license can be renewed."
38 39	SECTION 10. Chapter 88A of the General Statutes is amended by adding
40	the following new section to read:
41	" <u>§ 88A-19.1. Requirements for certification as a Board-approved school of laser,</u>
42	light source, or pulsed-light treatments.
43	(a) Any school in this State or another state that desires to be certified as a
44	Board-approved school of laser, light source, or pulsed-light treatments shall:

Schools shall immediately notify 23 the Board in writing of any sale, transfer, or change in ownership or management. 24 Every school shall display its certification in a manner prescribed by the (e) 25 Board. 26 All laser, light source, or pulsed-light devices used in the school shall be (f) 27 approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration." SECTION 11. G.S. 88A-20 reads as rewritten: 28 29 "§ 88A-20. Certification renewal. 30 Every certificate issued pursuant to G.S. 88A-19 or G.S. 88A-19.1 shall be renewed 31 annually. On or before the date the current certificate expires, the applicant must submit 32 an application for renewal of certification on a form approved by the Board, meet 33 criteria for renewal established by the Board, and pay the required fee. Failure to renew 34 the certificate within 90 days after the expiration date shall result in automatic forfeiture 35 of any certification issued pursuant to this Chapter."

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SECTION 12. This act is effective when it becomes law.
