The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of three hundred sixty-two thousand two hundred thirty-three dollars (\$362,233) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year and the sum of three hundred twenty-eight thousand nine hundred seventy-two dollars (\$328,972) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to fund the additional district court judge authorized for District Court District 3A by this act, the additional assistant district attorney authorized for Prosecutorial District 8 by this act, and two victim witness legal assistants for Prosecutorial District 8.

SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of two hundred eighty-four thousand one hundred twenty-eight dollars (\$284,128) for the 2007-2008 fiscal year and the sum of two hundred sixty-one thousand five hundred sixty-eight dollars (\$261,568) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to expand the family court pilot program established by Section 25 of S.L. 1998-202 by establishing a program in District Court District 3A.

SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.
