6	SECTION 1. G.S. 143-214.11 reads as rewritten:				
7	"§ 143-214.11. Ecosystem Enhancement Program: compensatory mitigation.				
8	(a) Definition. – For purposes of this section, the term "compensatory mitigation"				
9	means the restoration, creation, enhancement, or preservation of wetlands or other areas				
10	required as a condition of a section 404 permit issued by the United States Army Corps				
11	of Engineers.				
12	(b) Department of Environment and Natural Resources to Coordinate				
13	Compensatory Mitigation All compensatory mitigation required by permits or				
14	authorizations issued by the United States Army Corps of Engineers under 33 U.S.C. §				
15	1344 shall be coordinated by the Department consistent with the basinwide plans for				
16	wetlands restoration and rules developed by the Environmental Management				
17	Commission. All-Except as provided in Section (d1)(1) of this section, compensatory

37	(f) Mitigation Banks. – State agencies and private mitigation banking companies					
38	shall demonstrate that adequate, dedicated financial surety exists to provide for the					
39	perpetual land management and hydrological maintenance of lands acquired by the					
40		State as mitigation banks, or proposed to the State as privately operated and permitted				
41	-	mitigation banks.				
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42 (g) Payment for Taxes. – A State agency acquiring land to restore, enhance,
43 preserve, or create wetlands must also pay a sum in lieu of ad valorem taxes lost by the
44 county in accordance with G.S. 146-22.3."

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SECTION 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 2008.
