9	Laws and the Consumer Finance Act (Article 15 of Chapter 53 of the General Statutes) need to

1 **SECTION 6.** Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, subsistence, and 2 travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate. The 3 Commission, while in the discharge of its official duties, may exercise all powers provided for 4 under G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4. The Commission may meet in the 5 Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building.

6 With approval of the Legislative Services Commission, the Legislative Services 7 Officer shall assign professional staff to assist the Commission in its work. The House of 8 Representatives' and the Senate's Directors of Legislative Assistants shall assign clerical staff to 9 the Commission, and the expenses relating to the clerical employees shall be borne by the 10 Commission. The Commission may contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services as 11 provided by G.S. 120-32.02. If the Commission hires a consultant, the consultant shall not be a 12 State employee or a person currently under contract with the State to provide services.

All State departments and agencies and local governments and their subdivisions shall furnish the Commission with any information in their possession or available to them.

15 SECTION 7. The Commissioner of Banks shall use up to twenty-five thousand 16 dollars (\$25,000) of the funds available to the State Banking Commission for the 2009-2010 17 fiscal year to fund the study authorized by this act.

18 **SECTION 8.** The Commission shall report the results of its study and its 19 recommendations, including any proposed legislative changes, to the 2010 Regular Session of 20 the 2009 General Assembly. The Commission shall terminate on May 1, 2010, or upon the 21 filing of its final report, whichever occurs first.
