1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT DESIGNATING KIDNEY MONTH IN NORTH CAROLINA.
3	Whereas, North Carolina ranks ninth in the nation for the percentage of persons that
4	require kidney replacement therapy for kidney failure; and
5	Whereas, North Carolina spends five billion dollars per year on kidney
6	disease-related health expenses; and
7	Whereas, one in nine North Carolinians is at risk for developing chronic kidney
8	disease (CKD); and
9	Whereas, an increasing number of North Carolinians are at risk for developing CKD
10	due to our aging population, our level of obesity, plus the complications of diabetes and
11	hypertension; and
12	Whereas, almost half of those who currently have CKD may have been able to
13	prevent contracting this disease had they known the risk factors; and
14	Whereas, early detection and treatment of CKD may prevent undue suffering, the
15	need for dialysis treatments, and kidney transplantation, and decrease the financial burden of
16	CKD on the state; and
17	Whereas, the month of March is recognized as National Kidney Month; and
18	Whereas, observing the month of March as Kidney Month in the State of North
19	Carolina would help to promote public awareness of CKD; Now, therefore,
20	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
21	SECTION 1. Chapter 103 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
22	section to read:
23	" <u>§ 103-12. Kidney Month.</u>
24	The month of March of each year is designated as Kidney Month in North Carolina."
25	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
