3 4	Whereas, the United States Senate and House of Representatives have introduced the Safe Chemicals Act of 2010 to ensure that health risks from chemicals are adequately		
5	understood and managed; and		
6	Whereas, awareness and understanding of the complexity of the environmental		
7	impacts on human health are still growing; and		
8	Whereas, environmental factors have been implicated in the onset and exacerbation		
9	of numerous chronic and acute health problems such as diabetes, infertility, and kidney disease;

11	W	hereas, there are growing suspicions in the scientific community that one of the	
12	causes of the growing epidemic of autism spectrum disorders (ASDs) may be toxins in the		
13	environment; and		
14	Whereas, a growing number of studies indicate a strong link between environmental		
15	exposures and cancer; and		
16	Whereas, these diseases and disorders occur in all racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic		
17	groups; and		
18	Whereas, the diagnosis and treatment of these diseases and disorders place a huge		
19	financial burden on families, health insurers, and public assistance programs; Now, therefore,		
20	Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:		
21	SECTION 1. The Environmental Review Commission shall study the impact of		
22	environmental toxins on human health and report its findings and recommendations, including		
23	any proposals for legislation or administrative action, to the General Assembly no later than the		
24	convening of the 2012 Session of the 2011 General Assembly. The findings and
