A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO
ADOPT A POLICY ALLOWING A CERTAIN INCOME DISREGARD UNDER THE
MEDICAID PROGRAM.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 SECTION 1. The Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Medical 7 Assistance, shall adopt and implement a policy that will prevent a Medicaid recipient 8 (including MQB, QI-1, and QWD recipients) from losing Medicaid eligibility when the annual 9 Social Security and Railroad Retirement Cost of Living Adjustments (COLAs) and the annual 10 Federal Poverty Level adjustment cause a Medicaid recipient to become income-ineligible for Medicaid benefits. The policy shall apply only in cases where Medicaid income eligibility is 11 affected only by Social Security and Railroad Retirement COLAs and Federal Poverty Level 12 13 adjustments and shall not render a Medicaid recipient eligible if all other eligibility 14 requirements are not met. If approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 15 (CMS) is required for this policy to be implemented, the Department shall apply to CMS for 16 approval.

17 **SECTION 2.(a)** The Department of Health and Human Services, Division of 18 Medical Assistance, shall apply for a Medicaid State Plan Amendment to implement Section 1 19 of this act. If the State Plan amendment is approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 20 Services (CMS), then the Department may use funds available to reinstate eligibility lost due to 21 federal adjustments to income described under Section 1 of this act.

SECTION 2.(b) If the State Plan amendment required under subsection (a) of this section is approved by CMS, then there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Medical Assistance, the sum of eleven million two hundred eighty-eight thousand two hundred twenty-four dollars (\$11,288,224) for the 2009-2010 fiscal year and the sum of twelve million three hundred forty-eight thousand five hundred twenty-five dollars (\$12,348,525) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year to implement Section 1 of this act.

29 **SECTION 3.** Section 2(b) of this act becomes effective July 1, 2009. The 30 remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law and applies to all eligible Medicaid 31 recipients as of March 31, 2009.



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
