3	(7) Has willfully violated any provision of this Article or rules adopted by the
4	Board.
5	(b) The taking of any action authorized under subsection (a) of this section may be
6	ordered by the Board after a hearing is held in accordance with Article 3A of Chapter 150B of
7	the General Statutes. The Board may reinstate a revoked license if it finds that the reasons for
8	revocation no longer exist and that the person can reasonably be expected to perform the
9	services authorized under this Article in a safe manner.
10	" <u>§ 90-202.31. Violations of this Article; injunctive relief.</u>
11	(a) Any person who violates any provision of this Article shall be guilty of a Class 1
12	misdemeanor and may be subject to a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars
13	(\$1,000) for each violation of this Article.
14	(b) The Board may apply to the superior court for an order enjoining violations of this
15	Article, and upon a showing by the Board that any person has violated or is about to violate this
16	Article, the court may grant an injunction or restraining order or take other appropriate action."
17	SECTION 2. Any person who submits proof to the Board that the person has been
18	actively engaged in business as a pedorthist in this State for at least three consecutive years
19	before the effective date of this act and pays the required fee for the issuance of a license shall
20	be licensed without having to satisfy the requirements of G.S. 90-202.26, enacted by Section 1
21	of this act. All persons who do not make application to the Board within one year of the
22	effective date of this act shall be required to complete all requirements prescribed by the Board
23	and to otherwise comply with the provisions of G.S. 90-202.26.
24	SECTION 3. Notwithstanding G.S. 90-202.24(a)(1) and (2), as enacted by Section
25	1 of this act, the initial pedorthists appointed to the North Carolina Pedorthist Licensure Board
26	do not have to meet the licensure qualifications established under G.S. 90-202.26, as enacted by
27	Section 1 of this act. The appointees must be pedorthists certified by the Board for Certification
28	in Pedorthics and must apply for and obtain a license from the Board within 90 days after the
29	Board begins issuing licenses.

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SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
