2 AN ACT TO REPEAL THE LAW INCREASING THE NUMBER OF INSTRUCTIONAL 3

- DAYS IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.
- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5

SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-84.2 reads as rewritten:

"§ 115C-84.2. School calendar. 6

7 School Calendar. - Each local board of education shall adopt a school calendar (a) 8 consisting of 215 days all of which shall fall within the fiscal year. A school calendar shall 9 include the following:

- 10 (1)(See notes) A minimum of 185180 days and 1,025-1,000 hours of instruction covering at least nine calendar months. The local board shall designate when 11 12 the 185180 instructional days shall occur. The number of instructional hours in an instructional day may vary according to local board policy and does 13 not have to be uniform among the schools in the administrative unit. Local 14 15 boards may approve school improvement plans that include days with varying amounts of instructional time. If school is closed early due to 16 inclement weather, the day and the scheduled amount of instructional hours 17 18 may count towards the required minimum to the extent allowed by State Board policy. The school calendar shall include a plan for making up days 19 and instructional hours missed when schools are not opened due to 20 21 inclement weather. 22

- 24 The same or an equivalent number of legal holidays occurring within the (3)school calendar as those designated by the State Personnel Commission for 25 State employees. 26 27

- Five days, as designated by the local board, for use as teacher workdays. 28 (4a) These days shall be protected to allow teachers to complete instructional and 29 classroom administrative duties. The local school administrative unit shall 30 31 not impose any additional tasks on these days. The local board shall schedule one of these days at the beginning of the school year and one at the 32 33 end of each academic quarter.
- The remaining days scheduled by the local board in consultation with each 34 (5) school's principal for use as teacher workdays, additional instructional days, 35



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1 2 3	or other lawful purposes. Before consulting with the local board, each principal shall work with the school improvement team to determine the days to be scheduled and the purposes for which they should be scheduled.
4 5	Days may be scheduled and planned for different purposes for different personnel and there is no requirement to schedule the same dates for all
6	personnel. In order to make up days for school closing because of inclement
7	weather, the local board may designate any of the days in this subdivision as
8	additional make-up days to be scheduled after the last day of student
9	attendance.
10	If the State Board of Education finds that it will enhance student performance to do so, the
11	State Board may grant a local board of education a waiver to use up to five of the instructional
12	days required by subdivision (1) of this subsection as teacher workdays. For each instructional
13	day waived, the State Board shall waive an equivalent number of instructional hours.
14	Local boards and individual schools are encouraged to use the calendar flexibility in order
15	to meet the annual performance standards set by the State Board. Local boards of education
16	shall consult with parents and the employed public school personnel in the development of the
17	school calendar.
18 19	Local boards shall designate at least <u>two</u> <u>seven</u> days scheduled under <u>subdivision</u> (5) <u>subdivisions (4a) and (5)</u> of this subsection as days on which teachers may take accumulated
20	vacation leave. Local boards may designate the remaining days scheduled in subdivision
20	(5)subdivisions (4a) and (5) of this subsection as days on which teachers may take accumulated
22	vacation leave, but local boards shall give teachers at least 14 calendar days' notice before
23	requiring a teacher to work instead of taking vacation leave on any of these days. A teacher
24	may elect to waive this notice requirement for one or more of these days.
25	(b) Limitations. – The following limitations apply when developing the school
26	calendar:
27	(1) The total number of teacher workdays for teachers employed for a 10 month
28	term shall not exceed 195 days.
29 30	(2) The calendar shall include at least 42 consecutive days when teacher attendance is not required unless; (i) the school is a vacur round school; or (ii)
30 31	attendance is not required unless: (i) the school is a year-round school; or (ii) the teacher is employed for a term in excess of 10 months. At the request of
32	the local board of education or of the principal of a school, a teacher may
33	elect to work on one of the 42 days when teacher attendance is not required
34	in lieu of another scheduled workday.
35	(3) School shall not be held on Sundays.
36	(4) Veterans Day shall be a holiday for all public school personnel and for all
37	students enrolled in the public schools.
38	(c) Emergency Conditions. – During any period of emergency in any section of the
39	State where emergency conditions make it necessary, the State Board of Education may order
40	general, and if necessary, extended recesses or adjournment of the public schools.
41	(d) Opening and Closing Dates. – Local boards of education shall determine the dates of energing and closing the nublic schools under subdivision $(a)(1)$ of this section. Execut for
42 43	of opening and closing the public schools under subdivision (a)(1) of this section. Except for year-round schools, the opening date for students shall not be before August 25, and the closing
43 44	date for students shall not be after June 10. On a showing of good cause, the State Board of
45	Education may waive this requirement to the extent that school calendars are able to provide
46	sufficient days to accommodate anticipated makeup days due to school closings. A local board
47	may revise the scheduled closing date if necessary in order to comply with the minimum
48	requirements for instructional days or instructional time. For purposes of this subsection, the
49	term "good cause" means either that:
50	(1) Schools in any local school administrative unit in a county have been closed
51	eight days per year during any four of the last 10 years because of severe

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	weather conditions, energy shortages, power failures, or other emergency situations; or
	(2) Schools in any local school administrative unit in a county have been closed
	for all or part of eight days per year during any four of the last 10 years
	because of severe weather conditions. For purposes of this subdivision, a
	school shall be deemed to be closed for part of a day if it is closed for two or
	more hours.
