## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT AMENDING THE LOCKSMITH LICENSING ACT AND AUTHORIZING THE 3 NORTH CAROLINA LOCKSMITH LICENSING BOARD TO INCREASE CERTAIN 4 FEES. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 74F-3 reads as rewritten: 7 "§ 74F-3. Licenses required. required; use of locksmith tools. No person shall perform or offer to perform locksmith services in this State unless the 8 person has been licensed under the provisions of this Chapter. No person shall possess any 9 locksmith tools as defined under G.S. 74F-4(6) unless the person is licensed as a locksmith 10 under this Chapter or exempted from the provisions of this Chapter. A violation of this section 11 12 is a Class 3 misdemeanor unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment. Class 1 misdemeanor for the first offense. Any subsequent 13 14 offense shall be a Class I felony." **SECTION 2.** G.S. 74F-4 reads as rewritten: 15 "§ 74F-4. Definitions. 16 The following definitions apply in this Chapter: 17 18 Apprentice. – A person who has been issued an apprenticeship designation (1)19 by the Board. 20 Board. - The North Carolina Locksmith Licensing Board. (1a)Code book. – A compilation, in any form, of key codes and combinations. 21 (2)License. - A certificate issued by the Board recognizing the person named 22 (3) 23 therein as having met the requirements to perform locksmith services as defined in this Chapter. 24 25 (4) Locksmith. - A person who has been issued a license by the Board. Locksmith services. - Repairing, Services that include repairing, rebuilding, 26 (5) rekeying, repinning, servicing, adjusting, or installing locks, mechanical or 27 electronic locking devices, access control devices, egress control devices, 28 safes, vaults, and safe-deposit boxes for compensation or other 29 consideration, including services performed by safe technicians. The 30 31 definition also includes any method of bypassing a locking mechanism of any kind, whether in a commercial, residential, or automotive setting, for 32 33 compensation.
