1	A SENATE RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE 100 <sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE
2	BIRTH OF PRESIDENT RONALD REAGAN.
3	Whereas, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble background, worked
4	throughout his life serving freedom and advancing the public good, having been employed as
5	an entertainer, Union leader, corporate spokesman, Governor of California, and President of the
6	United States; and
7	Whereas, Ronald Reagan served with honor and distinction for two terms as the $40^{\text{th}}$
8	President of the United States of America; and
9	Whereas, during Mr. Reagan's presidency, he worked in a bipartisan manner to
10	enact his bold agenda of restoring accountability and common sense to government, which led
11	to an unprecedented economic expansion and opportunity for millions of Americans; and
12	Whereas, President Reagan's commitment to our Armed Forces contributed to the
13	restoration of pride in America, her values and those cherished by the free world, and prepared
14	America's Armed Forces to meet 21 <sup>st</sup> Century challenges; and
15	Whereas, President Reagan's vision of "peace through strength" led to the end of the
16	Cold War and the ultimate demise of the Soviet Union, guaranteeing basic human rights for
