2 AN ACT TO RESTORE THE SCHOOL CALENDAR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE 3 WAIVER TO PROVIDE FLEXIBILITY TO LOCAL BOARDS OF EDUCATION FOR 4 CALENDAR MODIFICATIONS NECESSARY TO ACCOMMODATE SPECIFIC 5 REASONABLE EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE, PROGRAMS FOR А AS 6 RECOMMENDED BY THE HOUSE STUDY COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION 7 INNOVATION.

8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 9

SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-84.2(d) reads as rewritten:

10 Opening and Closing Dates. - Local boards of education shall determine the dates "(d) of opening and closing the public schools under subdivision (a)(1) of this section. Except for 11 12 year-round schools, the opening date for students shall be no earlier than the Monday closest to 13 August 26, and the closing date for students shall be no later than the Friday closest to June 11. On a showing of good cause, the State Board of Education may waive the requirement that the 14 opening date for students be no earlier than the Monday closest to August 26 and may allow the 15 local board of education to set an opening date no earlier than the Monday closest to August 19, 16 to the extent that school calendars are able to provide sufficient days to accommodate 17 18 anticipated makeup days due to school closings. A local board may revise the scheduled closing date if necessary in order to comply with the minimum requirements for instructional 19 20 days or instructional time. For purposes of this subsection, the term "good cause" means that 21 schools in any local school administrative unit in a county have been closed eight days per year 22 during any four of the last 10 years because of severe weather conditions, energy shortages, power failures, or other emergency situations. 23

24 The State Board also may waive this requirement for an educational purpose. The term 25 "educational purpose" means a local school administrative unit establishes a need to adopt a 26 different calendar for (i) a specific school to accommodate a special program offered generally to the student body of that school, (ii) a school that primarily serves a special population of 27 students, or (iii) a defined program within a school. The State Board may grant the waiver for 28 an educational purpose for that specific school or defined program to the extent that the State 29 30 Board finds that the educational purpose is reasonable, the accommodation is necessary to 31 accomplish the educational purpose, and the request is not an attempt to circumvent the 32 opening and closing dates set forth in this subsection. The waiver requests for educational purposes shall not be used to accommodate systemwide class scheduling preferences. 33

The required opening and closing dates under this subsection shall not apply to any school 34 35 that a local board designated as having a modified calendar for the 2003-2004 school year or to



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1 any school that was part of a planned program in the 2003-2004 school year for a system of modified calendar schools, so long as the school operates under a modified calendar."

- 2 3 SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with 4 the 2015-2016 school year.
