## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE DESIGNER OF A RETAINING WALL OR SIMILAR 3 EROSION CONTROL DEVICE HAVING A STRUCTURAL FOUNDATION 4 REQUIRED TO BE INSTALLED UNDER A STATE-APPROVED EROSION AND SEDIMENTATION CONTROL PLAN TO CERTIFY THAT THE DEVICE HAS BEEN 5 6 DESIGNED IN ACCORDANCE WITH APPLICABLE CODES AND SPECIFICATIONS 7 AND WILL BE INSTALLED ACCORDING TO THE APPROVED EROSION AND 8 SEDIMENTATION CONTROL PLAN, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE LRC 9 COMMITTEE ON LAND DEVELOPMENT.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. G.S. 113A-54.1 is amend

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 113A-54.1 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

12 "(a2) When the erosion and sedimentation control permit is issued by the Department and 13 a retaining wall or other similar device requiring a structural foundation is included as a part of 14 the applicable approved erosion and sedimentation control plan, but is inspected and permitted 15 by a local government, the erosion and sedimentation control permit shall be conditioned to require that prior to allowing full land-disturbing activities to occur on either the entire property 16 or the portion thereof to be served by the applicable device, the erosion and sedimentation 17 18 control inspector shall receive written certification from the designer of the device assuring that 19 the device has been designed in accordance with applicable codes and specifications and will be installed according to the approved erosion and sedimentation control plan. The Department 20 21 shall provide a copy of the conditioned erosion and sedimentation control permit to the Chief 22 Building Code Enforcement officer of the local government responsible for inspection and 23 permitting of the erosion control device." **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2014, and applies to erosion 24

and sedimentation control permits issued by the Department on or after that date.
