6 7	Congress for a Convention of the States under Article V of the Constitution of the United		
8	States, and other states have either introduced or passed similar resolutions in at least one legislative body; and		
8 9	Whereas, the authors of the Constitution empowered state legislators to be guardians		
10	of liberty against abuses of power by the federal government; and		
11		Whereas, the federal government has created a crushing national debt through	
12	improper and imprudent spending; and		
13		Whereas, the federal government has invaded the legitimate roles of the states	
14	through the manipulative process of federal mandates, most of which are unfunded to a great		
15	extent; and		
16	Whereas, the federal government has ceased to exist under a proper interpretation of		
17	the Constitution of the United States; and		
18	Whereas, it is the solemn duty of the states to protect the liberty of our people,		
19	particularly for the generations to come, and to propose amendments to the Constitution of the		
20	United States through a Convention of the States under Article V of the Constitution of the		
21	United States to place clear restraints on these and related abuses of power; Now, therefore,		
22	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:
