2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE DISCLOSURE OF ESTABLISHMENT OF A FEDERAL		
3	CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE AND TO REQUIRE DISCLOSURE OF CERTAIN		
4	SOLICITATIONS BY LEGISLATORS AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL OF		
5	STATE.		
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 163-278.9 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:		
8	"(1) When filed by a candidate campaign committee as defined in G.S. 163-278.38Z for		
9	a legislator or member of the Council of State, each of the reports required by this section shall		
10	also disclose if the legislator or member of the Council of State has established a campaign		
11	committee under federal law. If the legislator or member of the Council of State has established		
12	a campaign committee under federal law, the report shall also disclose if the federal campaign		
13	committee has solicited or accepted a contribution from a registered lobbyist or lobbyist		
14	principal while the General Assembly was in regular session, as defined in		
15	<u>G.S. 163-278.13B(a)(3).</u> "		
16	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 138A-22 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:		
17	"(h) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a legislator or a public servant, as		
18	defined in G.S. 138A-3(30)a., shall supplement the filing of the statement of economic interest		
19	on a monthly basis while the General Assembly is in session if the legislator or public servant		
20	has established a federal campaign committee. The supplemental filing shall disclose any		
21	solicitation of or acceptance of contributions from a registered lobbyist or lobbyist principal, if		
22	any."		
23	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
