    - The Commissioner of Labor, or that officer's designee. (1)
    - **(2)** The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or that officer's designee.
    - The Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services, or that (3) officer's designee.
    - <u>(4)</u> The Secretary of the Department of Transportation, or that officer's designee.
    - The Secretary of the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency (5) Prevention, or that officer's designee.
    - The Secretary of the Department of Commerce, or that officer's designee. <u>(6)</u>
    - The Chairman of the Employment Security Commission, or that officer's <u>(7)</u> designee.
    - The Secretary of the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety. (8)
  - (d) The Task Force shall:
    - Identify long- and short-range goals for eliminating poverty in North (1) Carolina.
    - Develop a coordinated, integrated, ongoing approach among State agencies, **(2)** departments, and institutions to reduce poverty in the State by establishing and implementing poverty reduction targets.
  - (e) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate each shall appoint a cochair for the Task Force. The Task Force may contract for consultant services. The appointing authority shall fill vacancies on the Task Force.
  - The Task Force, while in the discharge of its official duties, has the power to request all officers, agents, agencies, and departments of the State to provide any information, data, or documents within their possession, ascertainable from their records, or otherwise available to them. The Task Force has the power to subpoena witnesses.
  - By March 1 of each year, the Task Force shall submit an annual report to the (g) Governor and to the General Assembly on its poverty reduction and economic recovery recommendations. Beginning January 1, 2015, and every two years thereafter, the Task Force shall determine whether there has been a reduction in poverty in the State. When the Task Force determines that poverty has been reduced by at least fifty percent (50%) from the effective date of this act, the Task Force shall make a final report to the General Assembly to that effect. The Task Force shall terminate upon filing the final report.

## "§ 143-751. Member expenses and travel reimbursements.

Members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation but may receive travel and subsistence as follows:

- Members who are officials or employees of a State agency or unit of local (1) government, in accordance with G.S. 138-6.
- (2) Members who serve in the General Assembly, in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1.
- All other members at the rate established in G.S. 138-5." (3)

**SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2013-2014 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to fund the work of the Task Force pursuant to this act.

**SECTION 3.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the

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- 2013-2014 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to fund the salaries and support costs associated with two new personnel positions in that Department dedicated to staffing the Task Force and implementing the interdepartmental collaboration among State agencies, departments, and institutions to advance poverty reduction and economic recovery in the State.
- 6 **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2013.

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
