## **General Assembly of North Carolina**

SECTION 11. There is appropriated to the Division of Juvenile Justice of the 1 2 Department of Public Safety the sum of six hundred fifty thousand nonrecurring dollars 3 (\$650,000) for the 2013-2014 fiscal year and six hundred fifty thousand nonrecurring dollars 4 (\$650,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to implement a pilot program for transitional housing for juveniles exiting youth development centers. The Division shall collaborate in this effort 5 6 with the Division of Social Services of the Department of Health and Human Services to 7 determine if populations served by the respective divisions can be served adequately through a 8 single transitional housing model. The Division may contract with appropriate service 9 providers to implement this pilot program as a public-private partnership. 10 **SECTION 12.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2013.
