# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

#### 2 AN ACT TO REMOVE MANDATORY FERRY TOLLING AND TO PROVIDE THE 3 DEPARTMENT WITH EXPANDED AUTHORIZATION TO GENERATE RECEIPTS 4

- TO SUPPORT ONGOING OPERATION OF THE FERRY SYSTEM.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6
  - SECTION 1. G.S. 136-82 reads as rewritten:

#### 7 "§ 136-82. Department of Transportation to establish and maintain ferries.

8 Powers of Department. – The Department of Transportation is vested with authority (a) 9 to provide for the establishment and maintenance of ferries connecting the parts of the State 10 highway system, whenever in its discretion the public good may so require, and shall collect tolls, as established by the Board of Transportation, on the ferry routes. The Board of 11 Transportation shall establish tolls for all ferry routes, except for the Ocracoke/Hatteras Ferry 12 13 and the Knotts Island Ferry require. For purposes of this Article, the "ferry system" shall be 14 defined as the ferry vessels and all associated equipment, land-based facilities, and personnel required to operate the vessels on routes established by the Board of Transportation. 15

To accomplish the purpose of this section said Department of Transportation is authorized 16 to acquire, own, lease, charter or otherwise control all necessary vessels, boats, terminals or 17 18 other facilities required for the proper operation of such ferries the ferry system or to enter into 19 contracts with persons, firms or corporations for the operation thereof of the ferry system and to 20 pay therefor such reasonable sums as maythat in the opinion of said Department of 21 Transportation represent the fair value of the public service rendered.

22 Authority to Generate Certain Receipts. - The Department of Transportation, (b) notwithstanding any other provision of law, may operate, or contract for the following 23 receipt-generating activities, and use the proceeds to promote, improve, repair, maintain, or 24 25 operate the ferry system:

- 26 (1)operation Operation of, concessions on the ferries and at ferry facilities to 27 provide to passengers on the ferries food, drink, and other refreshments, personal comfort items, Internet access, and souvenirs publicizing the ferry 28 29 system.
  - The sale of naming rights to any ferry vessel, ferry route, or ferry facility. (2)Advertising on or within any ferry vessel, including display advertising and (3)advertising delivered to passengers through the use of video monitors, public
  - address systems installed in passenger areas, and other electronic media."
  - **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
