A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT ALLOWING A COURT TO CONSIDER AS A TYPE OF RELIEF IN GRANTING A DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROTECTIVE ORDER THE USE OF A GPS TRACKING DEVICE ON A PERSON WHO HAS COMMITTED ACTS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 50B-3(a) is amended by adding the following new subdivision		
to read: "(a) If the court, including magistrates as authorized under G.S. 50B-2(c1), finds that an act of domestic violence has occurred, the court shall grant a protective order restraining the defendant from further acts of domestic violence. A protective order may include any of the following types of relief:		
 <u>(9</u>	Order a defendant the court finds has committed an act of domestic to be subject to electronic monitoring by means of a Global Po System (GPS) tracking device or other similar device that sends indicating the defendant's location to both the aggrieved party and law enforcement agency when the defendant is near or at any p location. The GPS tracking device or other similar device shall be the period fixed in the order. SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2014, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
