2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL CONSTITUENT INSTITUTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF
3	NORTH CAROLINA TO FULLY ADHERE TO THE COMPREHENSIVE
4	ARTICULATION AGREEMENT WITH THE NORTH CAROLINA COMMUNITY
5	COLLEGE SYSTEM REGARDING THE TRANSFER OF COURSES AND ACADEMIC
6	CREDITS BETWEEN THE TWO SYSTEMS AND THE ADMISSION OF TRANSFER
7	STUDENTS AND TO DIRECT THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AND THE
8	NORTH CAROLINA COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM TO REPORT BIANNUALLY
9	REGARDING THE AGREEMENT TO THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION
10	OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.
11	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
12	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 116-11 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
13	"(10c) The Board of Governors shall require each constituent institution to adhere
14	fully to the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement between The University
15	of North Carolina and the North Carolina Community College System that
16	addresses the transfer of courses and academic credits between the two
17	systems and the admission of transfer students. The Board of Governors
18	shall further ensure that the agreement is applied consistently among the
19	constituent institutions. The University of North Carolina and the North
20	Carolina Community College System shall conduct biannual joint reviews of
21	the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement to ensure that the agreement is
22	fair, current, and relevant for all students and institutions and shall report
23	their findings to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee,
24	including all revisions to the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement and
25	reports of noncompliance by November 1 of each year. The University of
26	North Carolina and the North Carolina Community College System shall
27	also jointly develop an articulation agreement advising tool for students,
28	parents, and faculty to simplify the course transfer and admissions process."
29	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
