12	<u>(a)</u>	There is established in the Office of the State Treasurer the Wildlife	Poacher			
13	Reward Fu	Reward Fund. Monies in the Fund shall be used to pay rewards to persons who provide				
14	information to the Wildlife Resources Commission or to law enforcement authorities that					
15	results in the arrest and conviction of persons who have committed criminal offenses involving					
16	the taking, injury, removal, damage, or destruction of wildlife resources. The Wildlife					
17	Resources	Commission shall establish rules for the administration of the Fund for	or these
