3	HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, TO PROVIDE STATEWIDE		
4	POISON CONTROL SERVICES THROUGH THE CAROLINAS POISON CENTER.		
5	Whereas, poisoning is the second leading cause of unintentional injury-related death		
6	in North Carolina; and		
7	Whereas, poisoning is the fastest growing cause of child fatality in North Carolina;		arolina;
8	and		
9	Whereas, the misuse of new synthetic drugs is a growing concern; and		
10	Whereas, poison control centers provide critical primary supports to the public and		
11	to medical professionals in handling poisoning cases and saving lives; and		
12	Whereas, the Carolinas Poison Center averted approximately \$9,500,000 in medical		
13	costs by diverting individuals from unnecessary emergency room visits in 2009, with		
14	approximately \$3,100,000 in savings accruing to Medicaid; and		
15	Whereas, yearly call volume has increased to approximately 100,000 calls per year;		
16	Now, therefore,		
17	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
18	SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Usetth and Human Services. Division of Public Health, the sum of one million four hundred		
19 20	Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of one million four hundred thousand dollars (\$1,400,000) for the 2012 2014 fixed user and the sum of one million four		
20	thousand dollars (\$1,400,000) for the 2013-2014 fiscal year and the sum of one million four hundred thousand dollars (\$1,400,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year. These funds shall be used		
21 22	to increase the State contract with the Carolinas Poison Center, the designated poison center for		
22	North Carolina operated by Carolinas Medical Center.
