4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 115D of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new			
6	section to read:			
7	" <u>§ 115D-4.2. Career prep adult high schools.</u>			
8	(a) The General Assembly finds that over one million North Carolinians above the age			
9		have a high school diploma. To be globally competitive, North Carol		
10	provide resources and opportunities for these adult workers to improve their education level to			
11	be qualified for the jobs of today and tomorrow. The educational opportunities currently			
12	offered by community colleges are not effectively reaching a high percentage of our workers			
13	that lack a high school diploma. Many of our workers need flexible scheduling to accommodate			
14	their work schedules; on-site drop-in day care services for those taking care of young children;			
15	individualized plans and intensive coaching; a curriculum designed for rapid progression; and			
16 17	other assistance that a community college may not be able to offer within currently available			
17 18	resources. These services may, however, be successfully provided at a career prep adult high school.

34	SECTION 2.(a) Forsyth Technical Community College and Central Piedmont			
35	Community College are authorized to contract with nonprofits for the operation of career prep			
36	adult high schools for the 2013-2014 fiscal year.

1 **SECTION 2.(b)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Community 2 Colleges System Office the sum of four million dollars (\$4,000,000) for the 2014-2015 fiscal 3 year. Of these funds, two million dollars (\$2,000,000) shall be distributed to Forsyth Technical 4 Community College, and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) shall be distributed to Central 5 Piedmont Community College and used to implement the provisions of this act.

6 It is the intent of the General Assembly to appropriate four million dollars 7 (\$4,000,000) on a nonrecurring basis for this purpose for the 2015-2016 fiscal year and for the 8 2016-2017 fiscal year. If this initiative is successful, it is the intent of the General Assembly to 9 incorporate funding for career prep adult high schools into the funding methodology for 10 community colleges.

11 **SECTION 2.(c)** Instruction provided by Forsyth Technical Community College 12 and Central Piedmont Community College for an approved career prep adult high school shall 13 not earn regular budget FTE so long as the college receives a direct appropriation for this 14 purpose.

15 SECTION 3. Forsyth Technical Community College and Central Piedmont 16 Community College shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on 17 September 1, 2015, and September 1, 2016, on the performance of students in the career prep 18 adult high schools. The report shall include data on the academic performance of students, the 19 graduation rate, changes in student income, and job placements after graduation. 20

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
