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6 7 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 62-101(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) No public utility or any other person may begin to construct a new transmission line without first obtaining from the Commission a certificate of environmental compatibility and public convenience and necessity. Only a public utility, as defined in this Article, may obtain a certificate to construct a new transmission line."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to certificates of environmental capability and public convenience and necessity issued on or after that date.

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
