

1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED			
2	AN ACT TO REMOVE CERTAIN LANDS FROM THE STATE NATURE AND HISTORIC			
3	PRESERVE, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW			
4	COMMISSION.			
5	Whereas, Section 5 of Article XIV of the North Carolina Constitution authorizes the			
6	dedication of State and local government properties as part of the State Nature and Historic			
7	Preserve upon acceptance by a law enacted by a three-fifths vote of the members of each house			
8	of the General Assembly and provides for removal of properties from the State Nature and			
9	Historic Preserve by a law enacted by a three-fifths vote of the members of each house of the			
10	General Assembly; and			
11	Whereas, the General Assembly enacted the State Nature and Historic Preserve			
12	Dedication Act, Chapter 443 of the 1973 Session Laws, to prescribe the conditions and			
13	procedures under which properties may be specifically dedicated for the purposes set out in			
14	Section 5 of Article XIV of the North Carolina Constitution; and			
15	Whereas, G.S. 113-44.14 provides for additions to, and deletions from, the State			
16	Parks System upon authorization by the General Assembly; Now, therefore,			
17				
18	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

20	SECTION 1. G.S. 143-260.10 reads as rewritten:			
21	"§ 143-260.10. Components of State Nature and Historic Preserve.			
22	The following are components of the State Nature and Historic Preserve accepted by the			
23	North Carolina General Assembly pursuant to G.S. 143-260.8:
