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SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Instruction the sum of three hundred forty-three thousand seven hundred twenty-two dollars (\$343,722) in recurring funds for the 2014-2015 fiscal year to provide NBPTS bonuses to teachers with NBPTS certification who are employed for at least seventy percent (70%) of their work time as instructional coaches in Title I schools.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2014.
