	ECTION 1. Article 8 of Chapter 18B of the General Statutes is amended by

	efinition. – For purposes of this section, the term "permit holder" means the holder		
	permit issued under G.S. 18B-1105, a distiller broker representative permit, or a		
•	sentative permit.		
-	uthorization. – A local board may allow a permit holder to conduct a consumer		
	at any ABC store within the local board's system subject to the following		
conditions:			
(1	The permit holder shall conduct the consumer tasting event and shall be		
	solely responsible for any violations of this Chapter occurring in connection		
	with the consumer tasting event.		
<u>(2</u>	The spirituous liquor shall be poured only by either (i) an employee of the		
	permit holder conducting the consumer tasting event who is at least 21 years		
	of age or (ii) the permit holder conducting the consumer tasting event.		
<u>(3</u>	Each consumer shall be limited to one one-quarter ounce tasting sample of		
	any product made available for sampling at the consumer tasting event, and		
	the total amount of the tasting samples offered to and consumed by each		
	consumer shall not exceed one-half ounce of spirituous liquor in any		
	<u>calendar day.</u>

	by any consumer who is visibly intoxicated.		
<u>(5</u>			
	by any consumer under the legal age for consuming spirituous liquor. The		
	person pouring the spirituous liquor shall be responsible for verifying the		
	age of the consumer being served by checking the identification of the

1	<u>(8)</u>	A local board shall allow consumer tasting events to be conducted only
2		between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on any day the ABC store
3		where the consumer tasting event is being held is authorized by law to sell
4		spirituous liquor, and no consumer tasting event shall be conducted for more
5		than three hours.
6	<u>(9)</u>	The local board shall not allow more than three consumer tasting events per
7		calendar week, and the local board shall not allow more than two different
8		permit holders to conduct a consumer tasting event at one time.
9	(10)	The local board shall designate a tasting area within the ABC store that
10		enables the permit holder to ensure that the consumer tasting event is being
11		conducted in compliance with this section. Consumers shall only be allowed
12		to consume tasting samples within the designated tasting area. The local
13		board shall maintain a floor plan at each ABC store within its system that
14		identifies the designated tasting area.
15	<u>(11)</u>	A consumer tasting event shall not be allowed unless the local board is
16		located in a municipality that has approved the sale of mixed beverages.
17	<u>(12)</u>	The permit holder conducting the event may provide point-of-sale
18		advertising materials and advertising specialties to consumers at the
19		consumer tasting event.
20	<u>(13)</u>	The local board may post notice of the consumer tasting event at the local
21		board's administrative offices and at any of the ABC stores within the local
22		board's system, and the local board may provide notice of the consumer
23		tasting event to any mixed beverage permittee that purchases spirituous
24		liquor from an ABC store within the local board's system.
25	<u>(14)</u>	The permit holder shall provide written notice of the consumer tasting event
26		to the ABC Commission at least 48 hours before the consumer tasting event.
27		The notice shall include the date of the consumer tasting event, the time of
28		the consumer tasting event, the ABC store at which the consumer tasting
29		event will be held, and the spirituous liquor that will be provided for tasting
30		at the consumer tasting event.
31	<u>(15)</u>	The permit holder shall maintain for a period of at least one year a record of
32		each consumer tasting event conducted. The record shall include the date of
33		the consumer tasting event, the time of the consumer tasting event, an
34		identification of the ABC store at which the consumer tasting event was
35		held, an identification of the spirituous liquor that was provided for tasting at
36		the consumer tasting event, and the name of any person who poured
37		spirituous liquor at the consumer tasting event. The permit holder shall allow
38	(4.5)	the ABC Commission to inspect those records at any time.
39	<u>(16)</u>	Any additional conditions imposed by the local board. Any additional
40		conditions shall be in writing, and the local board shall post notice of the
41		additional conditions at the local board's administrative offices and at all of

unlawful inducements to a local board."

SECTION 2. G.S. 18B-301 reads as rewritten:

"§ 18B-301. Possession and consumption of fortified wine and spirituous liquor.

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1	(e) Incident to Sale. – It shall be lawful to possess fortified wine and spirituous liquor at
2	any place, such as an ABC store, where possession is a necessary incident to lawful sale.
3	Consumption at such a place shall be unlawful unless the establishment has a permit
4	authorizing consumption on the premises as well as sale.sale or a consumer tasting event
5	authorized by G.S. 18B-800.1 is being conducted at the ABC store.
6	(f) Unlawful Possession or Use. – As illustration, but not limitation, of the general
7	prohibition stated in G.S. 18B-102(a), it shall be unlawful for:
8	(1) Any person to consume fortified wine, spirituous liquor, or mixed beverages
9	or to offer such beverages to another person:person at any of the following
10	places:
11	a. On the premises of an ABC store, orstore, unless a consumer tasting
12	event authorized by G.S. 18B-800.1 is being conducted at the ABC
13	store.
14	b. Upon any property used or occupied by a local board, or board.
15	c. On any public road, street, highway, or sidewalk.
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17	SECTION 3. G.S. 18B-1105(a) reads as rewritten:
18	"(a) Authorized Acts. – The holder of a distillery permit may:may do any of the
19	<u>following:</u>
20	(1) Manufacture, purchase, import, possess and transport ingredients and
21	equipment used in the distillation of spirituous liquor; liquor.
22	(2) Sell, deliver and ship spirituous liquor in closed containers at wholesale to
23	exporters and local boards within the State, and, subject to the laws of other
24	jurisdictions, at wholesale or retail to private or public agencies or
25	establishments of other states or nations;nations.
26	(3) Transport into or out of the distillery the maximum amount of liquor allowed
27	under federal law, if the transportation is related to the distilling process.
28	(4) Conduct consumer tasting events at ABC stores in accordance with
29	G.S. 18B-800.1."
30	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
