11	shall be designated on an annual basis by the State Librarian and the University Librarian				
12	University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and shall include publications of an his				
13	biographical, legal, or statistical nature relating to the State of North Carolina, past, pres				
14	future. These publications shall identify thereon, adjacent to the name of the agency respo				
15	for publication, a statement that the publication is printed on permanent paper.				
16	(b) By November 1 of each year, the State Librarian and the University Librarian	1 at the			
17	University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill shall designate the titles for publication on a	<u>lkaline</u>

North Carolina Historical Commission – creation, powers and duties. 10 There is hereby created the North Carolina Historical Commission of the Department of 11 Cultural Resources to give advice and assistance to the Secretary of Cultural Resources and to 12 promulgate rules and regulations to be followed in the acquisition, disposition, preservation, 13 and use of records, artifacts, real and personal property, and other materials and properties of 14 historical, archaeological, architectural, or other cultural value, and in the extension of State aid 15 to other agencies, counties, municipalities, organizations, and individuals in the interest of 16 historic preservation. 17 18 (3) The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations consistent with the 19 provisions of this section. All current rules and regulations heretofore 20 adopted by the Executive Board of the State Department of Archives and 21 History, the Historic Sites Advisory Committee, the North Carolina 22 Advisory Council on Historical Preservation, and the Executive Mansion 23 Fine Arts Commission, and the Memorials Commission shall remain in full 24 force and effect unless and until repealed or superseded by action of the 25 Historical Commission. All rules and regulations adopted by the 26 Commission shall be enforced by the Department of Cultural Resources."

SECTION 9. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
