SI	ECTION 1. G.S. 14-269 reads as rewritten:	
"§ 14-269. Carrying concealed weapons.

6	SECTION 1. G.S. 14-269 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 14-269. Carrying concealed weapons.

9	(b) This prohibition shall not apply to the following persons:
10	
11	(7) Any person who is an administrative law judge described in Article 60 of
12	Chapter 7A of the General Statutes and who has a concealed handgun permit
13	issued in accordance with Article 54B of this Chapter or considered valid
14	under G.S. 14-415.24, provided that the person shall not carry a concealed
15	weapon at any time while consuming alcohol or an unlawful controlled
16	substance or while alcohol or an unlawful controlled substance remains in
17	the person's body.

19	SECTION 2. G.S. 14-415.27 reads as rewritten:
20	"§ 14-415.27. Expanded permit scope for certain persons.
21	Notwithstanding G.S. 14-415.11(c), any of the following persons who has a concealed
22	handgun permit issued pursuant to this Article or that is considered valid under G.S. 14-415.24
23	is not subject to the area prohibitions set out in G.S. 14-415.11(c) and may carry a concealed
24	handgun in the areas listed in G.S. 14-415.11(c) unless otherwise prohibited by federal law:

26	(8) <u>A North Carolina administrative law judge.</u> "
27	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2015.
