16	(3)	Teachers and instructional support personnel who (i) complete a degree at
17		the master's, six-year, or doctoral degree level for which they completed at
18		least one course prior to August 1, 2013, and (ii) would have qualified for
19		the salary supplement pursuant to State Board of Education policy,

22	(4)	Teachers and instructional support personnel who do not qualify under subdivisions (1), (2), and (3) of this section but who spend at least seventy

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b. Work within the employee's area of graduate academic preparation. **SECTION 3.** Beginning with the 2015-2016 fiscal year and subsequent fiscal years thereafter, for teachers who are paid on the "M" salary schedule under subdivision (4) of

SECTION 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 2015.

may be moved off of the "M" salary schedule or discontinue receiving salary supplements if

SECTION 4. Unless an individual otherwise qualifies under subdivision (2) or (3)

they are not meeting the requirements of subdivision (4) of Section 2 of this act in that year.

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
