Short Title: Define Scope of Practice of CRNAs. (Public) Senator J. Davis (Primary Sponsor). Sponsors: Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT DEFINING THE PRACTICE OF NURSING BY CERTIFIED REGISTERED NURSE ANESTHETISTS UNDER THE NURSING PRACTICE ACT. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** G.S. 90-18(c) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(14a) The practice of nursing by a certified registered nurse anesthetist as defined in G.S. 90-171.20." **SECTION 2.** G.S. 90-171.20 reads as rewritten: "§ 90-171.20. Definitions. As used in this Article, unless the context requires otherwise: "Board" means the Board. – The North Carolina Board of Nursing. (1) "Health care provider" means anyHealth care provider. - Any licensed (2) health care professional and any agent or employee of any health care institution, health care insurer, health care professional school, or a member of any allied health profession. For purposes of this Article, a person enrolled in a program that prepares the person to be a licensed health care professional or an allied health professional shall be deemed a health care provider. "License" means aLicense. - A permit issued by the Board to practice (3) nursing as a registered nurse or as a licensed practical nurse, including a renewal thereof. Nurse anesthesia activities. – As defined in 21 NCAC 36.0226. (3a) "Nursing" is a Nursing. – A dynamic discipline which includes the assessing, (4) caring, counseling, teaching, referring and implementing of prescribed treatment in the maintenance of health, prevention and management of illness, injury, disability or the achievement of a dignified death. It is ministering to; assisting; and sustained, vigilant, and continuous care of those acutely or chronically ill; supervising patients during convalescence and rehabilitation; the supportive and restorative care given to maintain the optimum health level of individuals, groups, and communities; the supervision, teaching, and evaluation of those who perform or are preparing to perform these functions; and the administration of nursing programs and nursing services. For purposes of this Article, the administration of required lethal substances or any assistance whatsoever rendered with an execution under Article 19 of Chapter 15 of the General Statutes does not constitute nursing.

12		directly or indirectly."
13	SECTION 3.	This act is effective when it becomes law.
