20		conditions that the City Council may establish by resolution.	
21	<u>(3</u>) When any horse, dog, or other animal used by the Police Department or a	ıny
22		other City agency is deemed no longer fit for public service, the C	
23		Council may donate the animal to the officer or employee who had norm	nal
24		custody and control of the animal during its service to the City."
