17	<u>a.</u>	The number of teachers who left the profession without remaining in	
18		the field of education and the reasons for teachers leaving the	
19		profession.	
20	<u>b.</u>	The number of teachers who left their employment to teach in other	
21		states.	
22	<u>C.</u>	The number of teachers who left their employment to work in	
23		another school in North Carolina, including nonpublic schools and	
24		charter schools.	
25	<u>d.</u>	The number of teachers who left a classroom position for another	
26		type of educational position.	
27	<u>e.</u>	The number of hard-to-staff schools. A hard-to-staff school shall be	
28		any school identified as low-performing, as provided in	
29		<u>G.S. 115C-105.37.</u>	
30	<u>f.</u>	The number of positions in hard-to-staff subject areas. A	
31		hard-to-staff subject area is either of the following:	
32		<u>1.</u> <u>As defined by the United States Department of Education.</u>	
33		2. <u>A subject area that has resulted in a long term vacancy of 16</u>	
34		months or more at a particular school in a local school	
35		administrative unit."
