SECTION 1. G.S. 47-30.1 is repealed. SECTION 2. Article 2 of Chapter 47 of the General Statutes is amended by adding	
a new subsection to read:	
"§ 47-36.2. Correction of errors in recorded instruments.	
The following definitions apply to this section, unless the context requires a different	
meaning:	
<u>(1</u>	Attorney. – A person licensed to practice law under Chapter 84 of the General Statutes.
<u>(2</u>	
<u>\</u>	obvious description error, typographical error, or other minor error in a deed,
	deed of trust, or other instrument recorded with the register of deeds.
<u>(3</u>	Obvious description error. – An error in the legal description of real property
	that is contained in a recorded deed, deed of trust, mortgage, or other
	conveyance where the subject parcel is properly identified in the instrument

 SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2015, and applies to corrective affidavits filed on or after that date.
