A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO EXPAND THE DROPOUT PREVENTION AND RECOVERY PILOT 3 PROGRAM.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. S.L. 2014-104 reads as rewritten:

"SECTION 1. S.L. 2011-259 is repealed.

7 "SECTION 2. The State Board of Education shall establish a two-year three-year Dropout 8 Prevention and Recovery Pilot Program (Pilot Program). The State Board of Education shall 9 select one charter school in 2014 and one charter school in 2015 that hashave been approved by 10 the State Board under G.S. 115C-238.29D to provide the educational services and programming for the Pilot Program. The purpose of the Pilot Program is to reengage students 11 12 and increase the graduation rates in North Carolina through an educational program that 13 provides flexible scheduling and a blended learning environment with individualized and 14 self-paced learning options.

15 **"SECTION 3.** To be eligible to participate in the Pilot Program, the charter school's enrollment shall only include high school students who have (i) dropped out of high school or 16 (ii) transferred from their high school to the charter school. For the purposes of this act, high 17 18 school shall include ninth through twelfth grades. Transfer decisions shall be made by the 19 student who is 18 years of age or older or the student's parents or guardians. The charter school, 20 its affiliated charter management organization, or its education management organization must be accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools as an indicator of quality 21 22 instructional programming. All teachers employed by the charter schoolschools participating in 23 the Pilot Program shall be licensed teachers under G.S. 115C-296.

"SECTION 4. The charter <u>school schools</u> participating in the Pilot Program shall develop
and implement an alternative accountability model that meets the guidelines adopted by the
State Board of Education for alternative learning programs under G.S. 115C-12(24).

27 "SECTION 5. For the charter <u>school schools</u> participating in the Pilot Program, the 28 allotments and adjustments shall be made as provided in G.S. 115C-238.29H and shall be 29 adjusted on the basis of the average daily membership in the fifth month of the school year.

30 "SECTION 6. Existing charter schools meeting the criteria as provided in this act may 31 apply to participate in the Pilot Program starting with the 2014-2015 school year no later than 32 August 31, 2014. The State Board of Education shall select by September 30, 2014, the 33 participant for the Pilot Program for the 2014-2015 and through 2015-2016 school years. 34 Existing charter schools meeting the criteria as provided in this act may apply to participate in 35 the Pilot Program starting with the 2015-2016 school year no later than July 1, 2015. The State



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General Assembly of North Carolina Session 2015 1 Board of Education shall select by August 1, 2015, the participant for the Pilot Program for the 2 2015-2016 through 2016-2017 school years. 3 **"SECTION 7.** The State Board of Education shall submit a an interim report by February 4 15, 2016, and a final report by November 15, 2017, to the Joint Legislative Education 5 Oversight Committee by March 15, 2016, on the outcomes of the Dropout Prevention and 6 Recovery Pilot Program, including (i) the number of students who dropped out of high school, 7 enrolled in the program, and completed a high school diploma, (ii) the results of the alternative 8 accountability model, and (iii) the impact on the ADM Contingency Reserve. The report shall 9 also include any recommendations to enhance the effectiveness and the efficiency of the Pilot 10 Program funding and accountability models. 11 "SECTION 8. The Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee shall provide an 12 interim report to the 2016 Regular Session of the 2015 General Assembly on necessary 13 legislation to transition the Pilot Program into alternative charter schools serving high school 14 students who have dropped out of high school. The Joint Legislative Education Oversight 15 Committee shall make a final report on recommendations regarding the Pilot Program and its 16 outcomes to the General Assembly to the 2018 Regular Session of the 2017 General Assembly. 17 "SECTION 8.5. The State Board of Education and the Charter Schools Advisory Board 18 shall jointly report by December 15, 2014, to the General Assembly on the utilization of 19 contracts for personnel services by local boards of education and charter school boards of 20 directors. The report shall indicate both the purposes and the extent of such contracts prevalent

"SECTION 9. This act is effective when it becomes law. The Pilot Program shall begin
with the 2014-2015 school year and shall conclude at the end of the 2015-20162016-2017
school year."
