8	SI	ECTION 1.(a) Section 4 of Article IX of the Constitution of North	Carolina is
9	repealed.		
10	SI	ECTION 1.(b) Section 5 of Article IX of the Constitution of North Car	rolina reads
11	as rewritten:		
12	"Sec. 5. Powe	ers and duties of Board.<u>Department of Education.</u>	
13	The State Board of Education There is established within the Executive Branch a		
14	Department of Education which shall supervise and administer the free public school system		
15	and the educational funds provided for its support, except the funds mentioned in Section 7 of		
16	this Article, and shall make all needed rules and regulations in relation thereto, subject to laws		
17	enacted by the General Assembly. The head of the Department of Education shall be appointed		
18	by the Governor in accordance with law subject to confirmation by joint resolution of the		
19	General Assembly. The General Assembly shall provide by law for the filling of temporary		
20	vacancies in t	that position."	
21	SI	ECTION 1.(c) Section 7(1) of Article III of the Constitution of Nor	th Carolina
22	reads as rewrite	itten:	
23	"(1) Of	fficers. A Secretary of State, an Auditor, a Treasurer, a Superintender	nt of Public
24	Instruction,	an Attorney General, a Commissioner of Agriculture, a Commissione	r of Labor,
25	and a Commi	issioner of Insurance shall be elected by the qualified voters of the St	ate in 1972
26	and every fo	our years thereafter, at the same time and places as members of t	he General
27	Assembly are	e elected. Their term of office shall be four years and shall commence	on the first
28	day of Janua	ry next after their election and continue until their successors are e	elected and
29	qualified."		
30	SI	ECTION 2.(a) The amendments set out in Section 1 of this act shall be	e submitted
31	to the qualified voters of the State at a statewide election to be held at the time of the 2016		
32	North Carolina presidential preference primary, as provided in G.S. 163-213.2, which election		
33	shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots, voting		
34		oth may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes

6	SECTION 2.(b) If a majority of the votes cast on the question are in favor of the		
7	amendments set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the		
8	amendments to the Secretary of State, who shall enroll the amendments so certified among the		
9	permanent records of that office.		
10	SECTION 2.(c) If the amendments are approved by the qualified voters as		
11	provided in this section:		
12	(1) Section 1 of this act becomes effective January 1, 2017.		
13	(2) The terms of all members of the State Board of Education that would expire		
14	between certification of the amendment and December 31, 2016, are		
15	extended until January 1, 2017.		
16	(3) No general election for Superintendent of Public Instruction shall take place		
17	in 2016.		
18	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
