9	(a) <u>Claims Subject to This Section. – This section shall apply only to motor vehicle</u>			
10	liability claims for personal injury and to motor vehicle medical payments claims. This section			
11	shall not apply t	o workers' compensation claims, general accident and health in	surance claims,	
12	or claims submit	tted by, or on behalf of, enrollees to health benefit plans.		
13	(b) Definitions As used in this section, "chiropractic peer review" means the			
14	retrospective review of the treatment records of a chiropractic patient when requested by a			
15	third-party payer, performed by an individual who was not the patient's treating chiropractor,			
16	for the purpose of advising a third-party payer as to whether, in the reviewer's opinion, the			
17	services rendered by the treating chiropractor were clinically necessary and supported by			
18	-	nentation. Chiropractic peer review shall not include auton	-	
19	programs, reviews limited to coding and billing entries, or reviews performed by a third-party			
20	payer's in-house employees or individuals hired for the purpose of providing expert testimony			
21	in or preparing for litigation of personal injury claims. Materials submitted for chiropractic peer			
22	review shall be redacted to remove any information that would identify the provider of the			
23	chiropractic services.

25		opractor licensed under this Article shall meet all of the following	<u>g criteria:</u>	
26	<u>(1)</u>	Holds a current license to practice chiropractic in this State.		
27	<u>(2)</u>	Has practiced chiropractic in this State during the fi	ve-year period	
28		immediately preceding the chiropractic peer review.		
29	<u>(3)</u>	Derives at least half of his or her professional income from	providing care	
30		and treatment to chiropractic patients.		
31	<u>(4)</u>	If reviewing the treatment records of a chiropractor who has b		
32		a Diplomate in a specialty recognized by the State Board	of Chiropractic	
33		Examiners, holds a diploma in the same specialty.		



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1	(5) Does not collect a fee based on the extent to which the third-party paye	r

3	(d) Standard of Care. – When performing a peer review, the reviewer shall apply the	e	
4	standards of acceptable care in effect in this State at the time services were rendered.		
5	(e) Enforcement Any chiropractor licensed under this Article by the Board o	f	
6	Chiropractic Examiners is subject to disciplinary action under G.S. 90-154(b)(22).		
7	(f) Penalties Any individual who performs chiropractic peer review withou	<u>it</u>	
8	possessing a license as provided in this Article shall be subject to prosecution and injunctive		
9	action as provided in G.S. 90-147."
