#### FISCAL IMPACT SUMMARY

A fiscal estimate for the bill is not available.

#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### Section 2

This bill requires the production of five new special registration plates:

- A plate bearing the phrase "My Pet Is Family"
- A plate bearing the phrase "Electric Vehicle"
- A plate bearing the phrase "Home of the Venus Flytrap"
- A plate bearing the phrase "NC Fire Officer"
- A plate bearing the Special Olympics logo

Correction Enterprises will charge DMV a one-time fee of \$100 to create each new special registration plate template. Plate production costs vary based on the plate design, mostly related to the number of colors required. For example, pricing for an aluminum plate with graphic sheeting featuring full background color is \$4.68 per plate. Assuming issuance of 500 plates for each plate, production costs could total \$12,200 (5 plate types x 500 plates x \$4.68, plus \$500 total start-up cost). Additional costs for mailing and issuance and annual registration (renewal stickers) are assumed to be negligible.

Any impact to DMV operations is assumed to be nominal.
