5	SECTION 1. The General Statutes of North Carolina are amended by
6	adding a new Chapter to read:
7	" <u>Chapter 127C.</u>
8	"Advisory Commission on Military Affairs.
9	"§ 127C-1. Creation of the North Carolina Advisory Commission on Military
10	<u>Affairs.</u>
11	There is created in the Office of the Governor the North Carolina Advisory
12	Commission on Military Affairs to advise the Governor and the Secretary of Commerce
13	on protecting the existing military infrastructure in this State and to promote new
14	military missions and economic opportunities for the State and its citizens.
15	" <u>§ 127C-2. Membership.</u>
16	(a) <u>The North Carolina Advisory Commission on Military Affairs shall consist of</u>
17	21 voting members, who shall serve on the Executive Committee, and nine nonvoting,
18	ex officio members who shall serve by reason of their positions.
19 20	(b) <u>The Executive Committee shall be appointed as follows:</u> (1) Three members appointed by the General Assembly upon the

21	of whom shall be a member of a recognized veterans' organization.

Executive director. The Governor shall appoint, with the approval of the Executive Committee, an 16 executive director for the Commission who shall serve as the administrative head of the 17 Commission and be responsible for the operations and normal business activities of the 18 Commission, with oversight by the Executive Committee. 19 20 "§ 127C-4. Purposes. The Commission shall have the following responsibilities and duties: 21 22 (1)Advise the Governor and Secretary of Commerce on how to strengthen 23 the State's relationship with the military to protect the installations of 24 this State from the results of any future defense budget cuts or military 25 downsizing by providing a sound infrastructure, affordable housing, 26 and affordable education for military members and their families, 27 working to be viewed by national military leaders as the most military-28 friendly State in the nation. 29 Develop a strategic plan to provide initiatives to support the long-term (2)30 viability and prosperity of the military of this State that shall include, 31 at least: 32 A comprehensive Economic Impact Study of Military Activities a. 33 in North Carolina to be conducted by the North Carolina State 34 University Department of Economics and the East Carolina 35 Office of Regional Development. 36 Strengths/Weaknesses/Opportunities/Threats (SWOT) b. Α Analysis conducted by a professional strategic planning group 37 38 on the current status of the military in North Carolina. 39 Study ways to improve educational opportunities for military (3) personnel in North Carolina. 40 41 Assist in coordinating the State's interests in future activities of the (4) 42 Department of Defense.

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1	(5) Promote initiatives to improve the quality of life for military personnel
2	in this State.
3	" <u>§ 127C-5. Expenses of the Commission.</u>
4	(a) The Governor shall include the funding requirements for the Commission in
5	the annual budget for the Office of the Governor.
6	(b) Commission members shall receive per diem and travel reimbursements as
7	provided in G.S. 138-5 and G.S. 138-6, as appropriate."
8	SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of
9	the Governor the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year to
10	pay the travel and per diem expenses of the North Carolina Advisory Commission on
11	Military Affairs.
12	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.
