9	(a) Any	person who willfully injures or destroys any other person's agricultural		
10	crops or agricu	ultural plants is liable for three times the value of the crops or plants		
11	<u>injured or destroyed.</u>			
12	<u>(b)</u> <u>For</u>	purposes of this section, the value of agricultural crops or agricultural		
13	plants that are	grown for educational, testing, or research purposes include all of the		
14	<u>following:</u>			
15	<u>(1)</u>	The diminution in market value of the crops or plants when the crops		
16		or plants were grown for sale and the plaintiff is the entity who sold		
17		the crops or plants or would have sold the crops or plants but for their		
18		injury or destruction.		
19	<u>(2)</u>	Costs to the plaintiff for research and development of the injured or		
20		destroyed crops or plants.		
21	<u>(3)</u>	Other incidental and consequential damages proven to have been		
22		incurred by the plaintiff."
