A method of identifying and tracking children placed outside of the 1 (8) family unit in group homes or therapeutic foster care home settings." 2 3 SECTION 1.(b) The Department of Health and Human Services, in 4 conjunction with the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, the 5 Department of Public Instruction, and other affected agencies, shall submit a report on 6 April 1, 2003, on the method of identifying and tracking children placed outside of the 7 family unit in group homes or therapeutic foster care home settings to the House of 8 Representatives Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services, the 9 Senate Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, and the Fiscal 10 Research Division. **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115C-140.1(a) reads as rewritten: 11 12 "(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other statute and without regard for the place of domicile of a parent or guardian, the cost of a free appropriate public education 13 14 for a child with special needs who is placed in or assigned to a group home, foster home 15 or other similar facility, pursuant to State and federal law, shall be borne by the local board of education in which the group home, foster home or other similar facility is 16 17 located. However, the local school administrative unit in which a child is domiciled 18 shall transfer to the local school administrative unit in which the institution is located an amount equal to the actual local cost in excess of State and federal funding required to 19 20 educate that child in the local school administrative unit for the fiscal year. Nothing in 21 this section obligates any local board of education to bear any cost for the care and maintenance of a child with special needs in a group home, foster home or other similar 22 23 facility." 24 **SECTION 3.** The State Board of Education shall provide for a local school 25 administrative unit to request funds from the Group Homes Program for Children with Disabilities if a child assigned to that unit was not in that unit's April headcount for 26 27 exceptional children for the previous school year, even if the local school administrative unit received Group Homes Program funds for that child for a portion of the preceding 28 29 school year.

30 **SECTION 4.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective January 1, 2003. 31 Sections 2 and 3 of this act become effective July 1, 2003. The remainder of this act is 32 effective when it becomes law.
