A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN

SERVICES TO INCREASE THE COMMUNITY ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (CAP) INCOME ELIGIBILITY LIMITS AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS THEREFOR.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Effective October 1, 2001, the Department of Health and Human Services shall increase the income eligibility limit for the Community Alternatives Program (CAP) to three hundred percent (300%) of income eligibility for federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits. The Department shall allow individuals to deduct the same amount in maintenance allowance to support the recipient's spouse in the community as allowed for individuals in nursing homes.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of five million six hundred ninety-nine thousand five hundred fifty-eight dollars (\$5,699,558) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the sum of fourteen million nine hundred fifty-four thousand one hundred twenty-six dollars (\$14,954,126) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year. These funds shall be used to implement the increase in CAP eligibility as provided for in Section 1 of this act. Funds appropriated in this section shall be used to cover the increase in eligibility for the Community Alternatives Program and also to provide additional slots for the Program.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2001.
