8	SEC	<b>FION 1.</b> Article 2 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended

10	" <u>§ 115C-17.1. I</u>	Iot line to collect complaints alleging disparate treatment.
11	The Board s	hall establish a hot line to collect complaints alleging disparate treatment
12	of minority stud	ents and students from low-income families. The Board shall:
13	<u>(1)</u>	Establish teams to review and categorize the complaints for reporting
14		annually to the General Assembly.
15	<u>(2)</u>	Employ an appropriate number of hot line personnel who speak and
16		understand Spanish.
17	<u>(3)</u>	Implement a mechanism, where warranted, for the Board to respond to
18		and secure an independent and impartial investigation of systemic
19		problems revealed through the complaints.
20	<u>(4)</u>	Adopt a procedure for the Board to report individual complaints,
21		unless the person making the complaint requests otherwise, to the
22		appropriate local school administrative unit so that it may investigate.
23	<u>(5)</u>	Adopt criteria for a local investigation that assures fair and impartial
24		investigation.

The Board shall report annually to the General Assembly on the numbers and types of complaints handled by the hot line and how they were resolved."

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- SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Board of Education the sum of three hundred ninety-seven thousand one hundred fifty-five dollars (\$397,155) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year to implement this act.
- SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001. The State Board of Education shall implement the hot line by October 1, 2001.
