5	(a) In accordance with Board regulations, each pharmacy in North Carolina shall				
6	annually register with the Board on a form provided by the Board. The application shall				
7	identify the pharmacist-manager of the pharmacy and all pharmacist pharmacy				
8	personnel employed in the pharmacy. All pharmacist-managers shall notify the Board of				
9	any change in pharmacist pharmacy personnel within 30 days of such the change."				
10	SECTION 4. G.S. 90-85.24 reads as rewritten:

12	The Board of Pharmacy shall be entitled to charge and collect not more than the

28 29	as enacted by this act, if (i) the pharmacist-manager who employs the person certifies to the Board that the person has the training necessary to serve as a pharmacy technician				
30	and (ii) the person registers with the Board prior to July 1, 2002.
