The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 15B-2(1) reads as rewritten:	
"(1) "Allowable expense" means reasonable charg	-

other remedial treatment and care.	
Allowable expense includes a total charge not

SECTION 2. G.S. 15B-2(14) reads as rewritten:	41 :

1 Compensation for work loss will be limited to 26 36 weeks 2 commencing from the date of the injury, and compensation shall not 3 exceed three hundred dollars (\$300.00) four hundred dollars (\$400.00) 4 per week. A claim for work loss will be paid only upon proof that the 5 injured person was gainfully employed at the time of the criminally 6 injurious conduct and, by physician's certificate, that the injured 7 person was unable to work. However, a claim for work loss resulting 8 from time spent in court attending criminal proceedings will be paid 9 upon proof of the loss of an opportunity to work as a result of attending those proceedings." 10 11

**SECTION 3.** G.S. 15B-11(f) reads as rewritten:

''(f)Compensation for replacement services loss, dependent's economic loss, and dependent's replacement services loss may not exceed two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per week. Compensation for work loss may not exceed four hundred dollars (\$400.00) per week. Compensation for and-household support loss may not exceed three hundred dollars (\$300.00) per week."

**SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2001, and applies to injuries occurring on or after that date.

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
