A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE COVERAGE UNDER THE TEACHERS' AND STATE EMPLOYEES' COMPREHENSIVE MAJOR MEDICAL PLAN FOR MEMBERS OF BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, AND COUNCILS WHICH ARE STAFFED BY EMPLOYEES WHO ARE COVERED UNDER THE PLAN.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 135-40.2(a) is amended by adding the following new subdivision to read:

## "§ 135-40.2. Eligibility.

(a) The following persons are eligible for coverage under the Plan, on a noncontributory basis, subject to the provisions of G.S. 135-40.3:

..

(9) Members of regulatory boards and commissions and members of advisory boards, commissions, and councils who are not otherwise covered by this subsection and who receive staff support from employees who are covered by the Plan through an employing unit."

**SECTION 2.** G.S. 135-40.2(b) is amended by adding the following new subdivisions to read:

## "§ 135-40.2. Eligibility.

(b) The following person shall be eligible for coverage under the Plan, on a fully contributory basis, subject to the provisions of G.S. 135-40.3:

former members of regulatory boards and commissions and former members of advisory boards, commissions, and councils who were covered or would have been eligible for coverage under G.S. 135-40.2(a)(9) and who have served for a minimum of five years on the regulatory and advisory boards.

1	(15) The spouses and eligible dependent children of members of boards,
2	commissions, and councils enrolled under G.S. 135-40.2(a)(9) and
3	G.S. 135-40.2(b)(14). The surviving spouses of deceased members of
4	boards, commissions, and councils are also eligible for coverage under
5	this subsection provided the surviving spouse was covered by the Plan
6	at the time of death."
7	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Funds required to implement this act shall be allocated from
8	the operating budgets of the departments, agencies, institutions, boards, and
9	commissions whose employees are already covered by the Teachers' and State
10	Employees' Comprehensive Major Medical Plan. Nothing in this act obligates the
11	General Assembly to appropriate funds for the purposes of this act.
