2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY FOR HEALTH CARE
3	PROVIDERS PROVIDING HEALTH CARE TREATMENT TO PERSONS
4	INJURED BY A TERRORIST INCIDENT.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. Article 1B of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended
7	by adding the following new section to read:
8	"§ 90-21.18. Health care treatment of persons injured by a terrorist incident;
9	immunity.
10	(a) A health care provider or a person who provides emergency medical services
11	as defined in G.S. 131E-155 who renders medical, dental, or other health care treatment
12	to a person who is unconscious, ill, or injured by a terrorist incident shall not be liable
13	for damages for injuries alleged to have been sustained by the person or for damages for
14	the death of the person alleged to have occurred by reason of an act or omission in the
15	rendering of the treatment unless it is established that the injuries were or the death was
16	caused by gross negligence, wanton conduct, or intentional wrongdoing on the part of
17	the person rendering the treatment.
18	(b) The immunity conferred by this section applies only to the extent that
19	professional liability insurance covering the health care provider or person who
20	provides emergency medical services excludes coverage for treatment rendered during
21	acts of war or terrorist incidents. The immunity conferred by this section applies
22	whether or not the health care provider or person who provides emergency medical
23	services rendering the treatment is compensated for the treatment. This immunity shall
24	not apply to treatment performed outside the emergency setting of treatment during or
25	immediately after the terrorist incident.
26	(c) As used in this section, 'terrorist incident' means activities that occur within
27	the territorial jurisdiction of the United States, involve acts dangerous to human life that

- 7 SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to illness
 8 or injury resulting from terrorist incidents occurring on and after that date.
