6	SEC	TION 1. Part 5 of Article 1 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is	
7	amended by adding the following new section:		
8	" <u>§ 116-43.5.</u>	State grants to aid eligible students attending certain private	
9		tutions of higher education; administrative procedure.	
10	(a) Defin	nitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:	
11	<u>(1)</u>	"Institution" means a nonprofit educational institution with a main	
12		permanent campus located in this State that satisfies all of the	
13		following:	
14		a. <u>Is not owned or operated by the State of North Carolina or by</u>	
15		an agency or political subdivision of the State or by any	
16		combination thereof.	
17		b. Is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and	
18		Schools under the standards of the College Delegate Assembly	
19		of the Association.	
20		 <u>c.</u> Awards a postsecondary degree as defined in G.S. 116-15. <u>d.</u> Its students are not eligible for a similar State grant under 	
21			
22		another State program.	
23	<u>(2)</u>	"Main permanent campus" means a campus that is owned by the	
24		institution that provides permanent on-premises housing, food	
25		services, and classrooms with full-time faculty members and	
26		administration that engage in postsecondary degree activity as defined	

in G.S. 116-15.

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1	(3) "Student" means a person enrolled in and attending an institution		
2	located in the State (i) who qualifies as a resident of North Carolina in		
3	accordance with definitions of residency that may from time to time be		
4	adopted by the Board of Governors of The University of North		
5	Carolina and published in the residency manual of the Board, and (ii)		
6	who has not received a bachelors degree, or qualified therefor, and		
7	who is otherwise classified as an undergraduate under such regulations		
8	as the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina may		
9	promulgate. Qualification for in-State tuition under G.S. 116-143.3		
10	makes a person a "student" as defined in this subdivision.		
11	(b) Eligibility. – A student is eligible for a State grant under this section for an		
12	academic year if the student is a full-time North Carolina undergraduate student		
13	attending an institution as defined by this section and is not eligible for a similar State		
14	grant under another State program for the same academic year.		
15	(c) Administration. – The State grants provided for in this section shall be		
16	administered by the State Education Assistance Authority pursuant to rules adopted by		
17	the State Education Assistance Authority not inconsistent with this section. The State		
18	Education Assistance Authority shall pay the State grant to each student eligible under		
19	this section. The amount of the grant shall be determined by the General Assembly. The		
20	State grant shall be paid to a student only after the student completes the academic year.		
21	The grant shall be paid directly to the student on or after July 1 following the		
22	completion of the academic year. The State Education Assistance Authority shall not		
23	remit any grant until it receives proper certification from an institution that the student		
24	applying for the grant is an eligible student.		
25	(d) Shortfall. – In the event there are not sufficient funds to provide each eligible		
26	student with a full grant: Each eligible student shall receive a pro rata share of funds		
27	then available for the appropriate academic year within the fiscal period covered by the		
28	current appropriation.		
29	(e) <u>Reversion. – Any remaining funds shall revert to the General Fund.</u>		
30	(f) A State grant authorized by this act shall be reduced by twenty-five percent		
31	(25%) for any individual student who has completed 140 semester credit hours or the		
32	equivalent of 140 semester credit hours.		
33	(f1) The State Education Assistance Authority shall document the number of		
34	full-time equivalent North Carolina undergraduate students that are enrolled in private		
35	institutions and the State funds collected by students at each institution under this		
36	section. The State Education Assistance Authority shall report those findings to the		
37	Secretary of Administration, the House and Senate Appropriations Subcommittees on		
38	Education, and the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee.		
39	(g) <u>The State grant shall not be used for any student who:</u>		
40	(1) <u>Is incarcerated in a State or federal correctional facility for committing</u>		
41	<u>a Class A, B, B1, or B2 felony; or</u>		
42	(2) <u>Is incarcerated in a State or federal correctional facility for committing</u>		
43	a Class C through I felony and is not eligible for parole or release		
44	within 10 years."		

1 **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2003, and applies to the 2 2003-2004 academic year and each year thereafter.
